Part 1 - A lot of people looked down on me just because I didn't have a high school diploma. It didn't matter how intelligent I was or how moral I was or how kind I was to others. "You're nobody without this piece of paper," said someone long ago, but not as kind as I say it now. I remember one of my old roommates ridiculing me in front of her friends during an argument. "Do you have one of these?" she asked me waving her month old high equivalency scores she received from a drop back in

program in my face. "You're stupid, you're worthless. You're supposedly holier than thou, but yet you do not even have a freaking diploma." Every one of them laughed as I thought of Audrey Hepburn's line in *My Fair Lady*: "just you wait."

And it wasn't just her; no one respected me because I didn't have my diploma. I know staff from once specific program was always very curt with me when we spoke and whenever I would share with her some goal I wanted to accomplish she would respond with "Sweetheart, I am sorry to say it but you would need a high school diploma for that." I kept thinking to myself, how many people made it without a high school diploma? A lot do. I began to wear that title as a crown.

When I had opportunities to advocate for kids in care, there was always someone to budge in the middle of my conversations and say "Did you know Tamarra is studying for her GED?" I would watch instantly all admiration or interest in my argument drain from their face. I had lost my audience. I now was a brute to them. The rest of our conversation would be about me studying for my GED as if that is the most attractive topic to talk about. Sometimes I wanted to scream "Why don't you just write it on my name badge or have a whole segment on me on *60 Minutes*. That way the world will already know." In their mind it was said with good intentions, but boy did it fire me up.

When one of my friends told me that a case manager told her that I could commit myself to being an advocate, but couldn't bring myself to take the test. Well that was the straw that broke the camel's back.

All of it was the truth, but no one ever bothered to ask me what happened. *How come you don't have a high school diploma, Tamarra?* Did they have to be so mean? All they did was point fingers and make me feel so small. *Tamarra is milking the system. Tamarra is being lazy and doesn't really want to succeed in school.* Are you kidding me? I have wanted to become a Senator since I was 15 years old. How could I do that without an education?

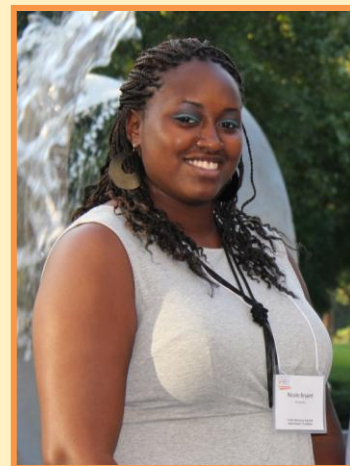

Christina has taught me two great things: everyone has a story and everyone has a voice that should be heard.
